- All other students take PHYC10007 Physics of Biomedicine.

Blank options:

- You must complete 4-6 breadth subjects. Two of the Level 2 psychology subjects that are part of the APAC accredited sequence are classified as breadth for Biomedicine students (as indicated on the study plan). Likewise, some of the Level 3 electives are also classified as breadth, if selected these will count towards your major and the breadth components of your course. Your two choice (blank) subjects can either be breadth or selective, the choice depending on what you have chosen to complete as part of your major.
