Method for the preparation of micro-RNA and its therapeutic application: a discussion of patent law concepts in the context of a patent office decision.

Mark's work focuses on the preparation and prosecution of patent applications in Australia and internationally, due diligence, freedom to operate and invalidity advice for the pharmaceutical, biotechnology, health and medical device industries.

Mark majored in genetics, biochemistry and molecular biology for his BSc(Hons) at the University of Melbourne, and his PhD work at WEHI focussed on the molecular and cellular biology of malaria.

Mark conducted four years of postdoctoral research at the Michael Smith Laboratories (named for its Nobel Prize-winning Director) at the University of British Columbia in Canada. His work focussed on the immunologic and inflammatory responses to infectious agents at the molecular and cellular level. Upon returning to Australia as part of a CJ Martin Fellowship, Mark conducted further post-doctoral research at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute. Mark is a partner of Phillips Ormonde Fitzpatrick, a leading intellectual property firm in Australia.
